| _____ CANTELIVER | a. | An upright post in the framework of a wall for supporting sheets of lath, wallboard, or similar material. |
| _____ BEARING WALL | b. | A framed opening, as in a wall, door, or window, fitted with fixed or movable horizontal slats for admitting air and light and shedding rain. |
| _____ ARCH | c. | The front of a building, especially an imposing or decorative one. |
| _____ BUTTRESS | d. | An external structure usually brick or stone, built against a wall or other element to support or reinforce it. |
| _____ ARCADE | e. | A horizontal element only supported on one side |
| _____ STUD | f. | The overhang at the lower edge of a roof. |
| _____ CLERESTORY | g. | A curved symmetrical structure spanning an opening and typically supporting the weight of a bridge, roof, or wall above it. |
| _____ EAVES | h. | A covered passageway with arches along one or both sides. |
| _____ FACADE | i. | A wall which supports any vertical load in a building (such as floors, roofs, joist, beams or girder) as well as its own weight. |
| _____ LOUVER | j. | A portion of an interior rising above the rooftops and having windows admitting daylight to the interior. |
